Her owner took her to the local vet but confessed to having no means to pay. The vet was Wendy Lane (we happen to work closely with Wendy and she featured on our last newsletter cover). Wendy suggested that without finances it is never a good idea to keep a pet in the first place and in Tiddles case money needs to be spent both now and possibly again in the near future. Tiddles owner then realised she would never have enough free cash to look after her properly and as a way of solving the problem Wendy asked us if we could take control of the case. Happily, Tiddles is now officially signed over to us and is on the mend and .... wait for it.... she is ready for a new home! Please get in touch if you could offer her a new home.



## AN EXOTIC LIZARD

Just as Bubbles was having his picture taken (see inside) someone arrived at the Centre with a bearded dragon lizard in a shoebox.

Exotic pets like this are proving to be a big problem for the RSPCA. They are bought as pets but very rarely are they looked after properly.

Once the novelty has worn off the owners realise just how difficult they are to look after. Before acquiring a bearded dragon it is crucial that a potential owner finds out about the animal - including how to provide for the animal's needs when kept in captivity, how big it gets and how long it lives, (they can live between seven and twelve years in captivity). Bearded dragons are completely dependent on their owners to provide them with the correct accommodation, heating, lighting and food, all of which must replicate as closely as possible their wild habitat. Further information on their care can be found on the RSPCA national society website. Let's hope there is someone with the right expertise and commitment who will come forward to adopt it.
